Health Care

Indian River has a well staffed Urgent Care in town and several Doctor's Offices. We have McLaren Hospital in Petoskey which is rated in the Top 100 Hospitals in the Country. They have a branch in Cheboygan. Otsego Hospital is also excellent and is also 30 minutes a way in Gaylord. In Indian River there is good ambulance service, several Physical Therapy offices which also offer exercise classes (not during Covid), chiropractors,



massage therapists and acupuncture. Much more is offered in the nearby towns of Petoskey, Cheboygan and Gaylord, all less than 30 minutes away.

Education

Indian River has Inland Lakes School which is a regional school, grades Pe-School through 12. It offers a college prep curriculum and also some technical training. North Central Michigan College is in Petoskey, a neighboring community. There are a variey of Private schools in the area for grades K-12.
